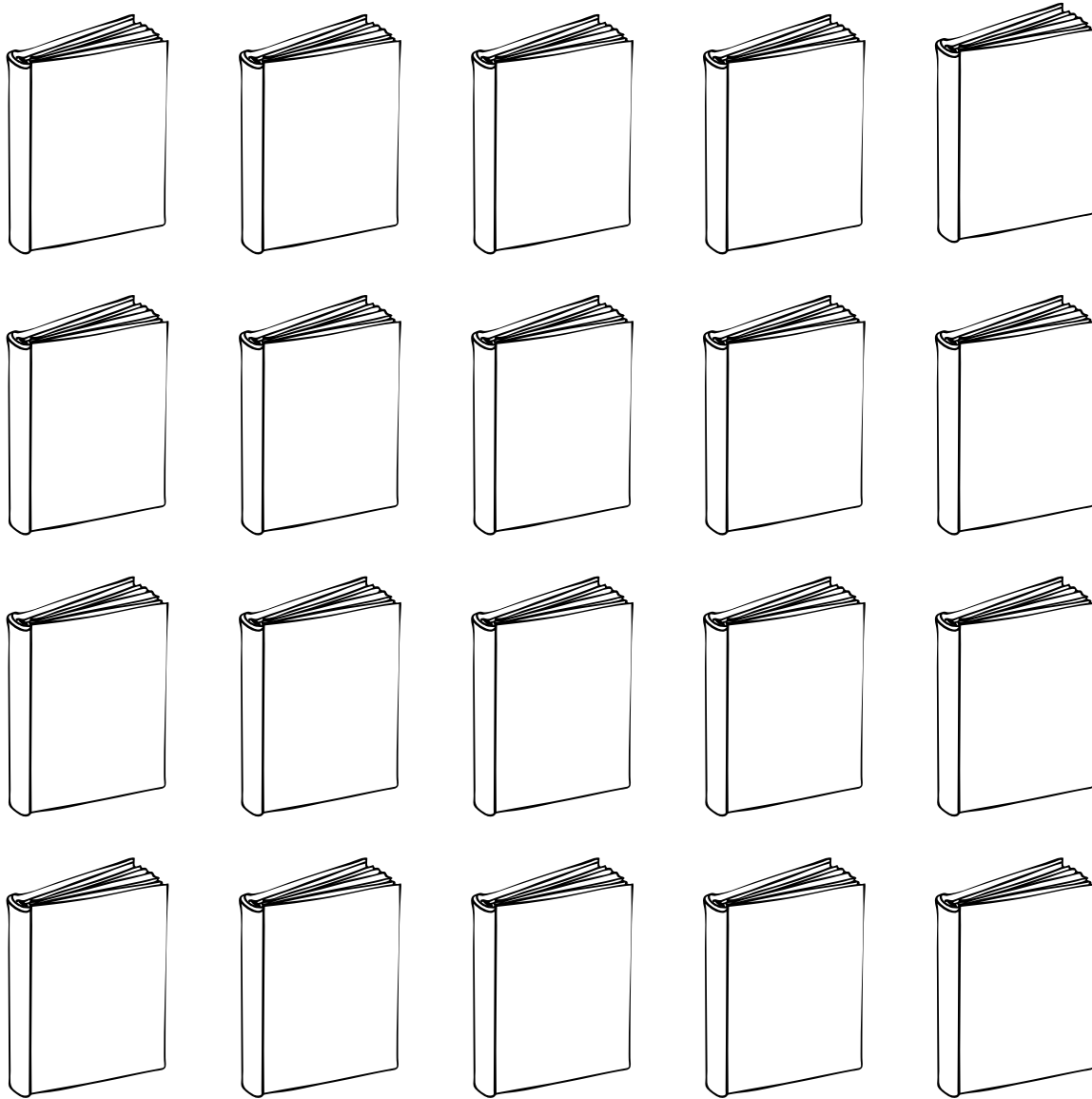
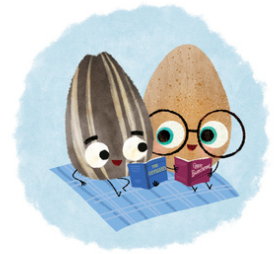

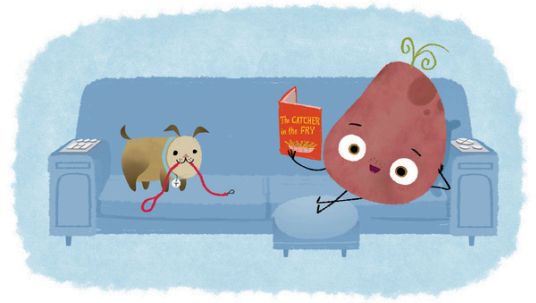

Ideas for Activities

Read

- Read books
- Listen to audiobooks
- Discuss books and ask questions as you read
- Point to short "sight" words as you read and ask your child what letter they start with



Write

- Write your child's name using cereal
- Use scarves or bubbles to write letters or just build up hand muscles
- Let your child scribble with crayons - this is writing practice
- Strengthen hand muscles with blocks or sorting toys
- Write words your child uses often on small papers and place them around the house

Sing

- Listen to music in the car or at home. Some of our favorite artists are *Ralph's World*, *Carole Peterson*, *Hap Palmer*, *Ella Jenkins*, *Laurie Berkner*.
- Sing Nursery Rhymes like "Twinkle, Twinkle," "The Itsy Bitsy Spider." Rhyme is important for kids.
- Do Karaoke or a dance-along to your child's favorite songs
- Sing in other languages like Spanish, French, or Chinese
- Sing the alphabet song. Use plastic, wooden, or magnetic letters as a prop.

Talk

- Ask your child about their day at school or camp
- At the end of the day, discuss what you did, what happened first, second, and last
- When your child tells you something, add on to it with a new fact about that topic

Play

- Play "Library" with your child's books. Let your child "check out" books to their stuffed animals.
- Make paper bag puppets of animals or people that interest your child
- Make up a story using your child's dolls, trucks, or toys. Have your child say what's happening.
- Play pretend (or real) kitchen, tea party, or restaurant. Use props and your child's imagination!
